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For its 56th edition, Visions du Réel is offering the public several opportunities to go behind the scenes of contemporary filmmaking from different angles: masterclasses, Morning Talks and themed walks are further additions to the rich programme of screenings. These moments offer unique opportunities to reflect on cinema outside the screen. The festival's masterclasses, spaced across the festival dates, provide a chance for audiences to explore the captivating world of the guest filmmakers and engage in discussions with them. This year, Raoul Peck, Corneliu Porumboiu, and Cláudia Varejão will be participating in these sessions, offering unique insight into their filmmaking journeys. On the other hand, Morning Talks bring together a group of filmmakers in the morning to discuss content and form. Conceived in the spirit of an open forum, these conversations focus on a selection of films screened the previous day and highlight common themes or topics. Finally, in an even more relaxed format, a series of themed walks in the heart of the city or by the lake provide an opportunity to delve deeper into the themes of the films and discuss them in more detail with the filmmaking team and/or external experts.

Sunday 6 April - In pursuit of a collective character

Filming is about bringing one or more beings to life on the big screen, sometimes oneself, in a universe whose singular geography the camera aims to decipher, reconstruct its lines of force, and reveal the relationships that are formed between individuals and the collective character that encompasses them. Whether they are working on the scale of history, an institution or a family, these filmmakers of reality capture a sensitive tectonic structure made up of repression, oppositions, forgetfulness and negociations. What methods are they forging to stage the dialectic that links an individual trajectory and its inscription in a collective framework?

Monday 7 April - Scripting Reality or Real-life Scenarios

In line with a shared aesthetic convention, the documentary has long been negatively identified as a 'non-fiction', always tempted by the myth of transparency and a formal search for objectivity, favouring the subject over cinematographic invention. However, the last 30 years have confirmed the growing subjective share of representations of reality, whether observational, interactive or reflexive. How do contemporary filmmakers script their films, from the most obvious stage of writing to that of editing, when the filmed material is transformed into a narrative? How does their imagination permeate the story they want to convey to us?

Tuesday 8 April - Telling the minority realities against the 'narratives' of power

We are currently experiencing the spectacular future of societies where the 'true' is now only a moment of the false orchestrated by algorithms, a dangerous spiral that threatens our autonomy of judgement. However, documentary filmmakers can crack the dominant narratives and film in the gaps, in a way under the radar. But how can the cinematographic apparatus, by definition artifical, be used to touch on a truth, even a partial one, by distorting it without perverting it? By what means can filmmakers reconcile their artistic vision with questions of ethics and respect for their protagonists?
